Start the new year by letting your representatives know that the education of all children and care of our climate are priorities. Taking action will take just a minute or two of your time.



Interrupting the school-to-prison pipeline remains a key priority for all of us. Urge your federal legislators to become co-sponsors of two crucial acts:

Ending PUSHOUT Act

Protecting Our Students in Schools Act

United Women in Faith also has the same email tool to send a message to President Biden regarding the conflict in Gaza. The following email was sent December 12:

Dear United Women in Faith Leaders and Friends,

More than 16,200 people have been killed in Gaza, the majority women and children. This is a humanitarian catastrophe.

The UMC Social Principles state, "As disciples of Christ, we are called to love our enemies, seek justice, and serve as reconcilers of conflict. We insist that the first moral duty of all nations is to work together to resolve by peaceful means every dispute that arises between or among them. ... We believe that human values must outweigh military claims as governments determine their priorities."

Per UN Women, 85 percent of the total population of Gaza has been displaced, including 951,490 women and girls. Fifty thousand women in Gaza are pregnant, with over 180 giving birth each day, and many are unable to receive care or access medical resources for emergency C-sections or clean water for mixing infant formula.




2024 Program Resources

Mission Giving

United Women in Faith is mission giving. The understanding of the total programs of our organization as mission becomes very important as funds are received and disbursed. Without mission education, advocacy for the marginalized does not take place. Without continual spiritual growth, social action becomes shallow. Without a solid supportive community, women are unable to care for their own needs and the needs of others.

As an organization, United Women in Faith has not merely sent money from a distance. Women have always understood giving as an expression of God's grace. Members are active in ministry with Jesus. Their faith has led them to follow the gospel and support the mission and ministry of Jesus.

Women, children and youth are most often the ones who are left out of God's feast. Too often, they are the poorest of the poor. They are systematically marginalized without access to education, healthcare and decision making. The barriers of discrimination around sex, class and race make our efforts for a just world extremely difficult.

Responsible stewardship of God's gifts is a challenge for individual Christians, especially in a culture and economic system where accumulation is valued and rights of ownership unquestioned. Responsible stewardship is also a challenge for United Women in Faith. The accountability of both the giver and the receiver are required to be in giving in community. Decisions about budgets and giving are based on a strong belief in mission education, leadership development and the needs of women, children and youth.

In preparation for the Christmas Eve service, Cunningham's Chaplain organized two reflective activities for youth at Cunningham Children's Home, to be able to share their responses to the questions, "Where do you need peace?" and "What do you hope will happen in your lifetime?"

She collected answers about peace in a prayer concern box where all could anonymously submit what is on their hearts. Their prayer requests included:

- That my sister will trust me and like me again:
- My parents not being alive
- •Getting a family
- For good things to come my way
- •I need peace with everything
- •My family
- •I need peace with myself and what my purpose is
- •No wars, fighting, arguing
- •That I have not found my dad
- •My family to help me get though being in a group home

Responses to "What do you hope will happen in your lifetime?" were written on stars and hung on the wall behind figures of The Wisemen. In The Nativity, The Wisemen believed the star meant something new, something big, was about to happen. They hoped to be there, be part of it, to see something miraculous unfold. They made a journey based on this hope for the future. Our youth hope that in their lifetime there is:

- •No abandonment of children
- Peace and relief
- •Me going home
- Stop drugs
- •To never be without family
- World peace
- •Genuine, loving people
- •Stop the shooting
- •Stay calm and happy no matter what
- •To get married to a wonderful wife
- •My puppy and I to live a long life

Kids Above All believes in ensuring the safety, well-being, and education of kids above all else. In 2023, Deaconess Catherine initiated an agencywide effort to collect 500 pounds of pliable plastics to keep it from going into the landfill. NexTrex., a nationwide company making responsible outdoor products, offered this community service opportunity in the effort to engage schools, companies, and other groups like Kids Above All to step up in practical ways to be more environmentally aware.

Deaconess Catherine brought together a Green Team of KAA site ambassadors to provide leadership. Today, KAA has been awarded their first NexTrex bench (see photo) and they are working on completing their second collection of 500 pounds by mid-January 2024. Thank you to Vera Miller on the Green Team at FUMC Downers Grove for organizing a collection to help KAA! In addition, Lois Voss at Cary UMC and her UWFaith unit contributed two different times. There are several other UWFaith persons who brought their collections to the Annual Celebration in October. Thank you to everyone for stepping up for all our kids by saving pliable plastics from going into the landfills. This is Love In Action! In 2024, Kids Above All will decide whether or not to continue this effort as NexTrex has changed their rules to collecting 1000 pounds for one bench over one full year. Stay tuned.
